

Faith Without Works is Dead ~ Taming the Human Tongue

James 2:26 - 4:17

Sunday, 2/28/2010

Note 1: If one reads James without feeling guilt, he is perfect, or he didn't read it very thoughtfully.

Note 2: If one teaches James without feeling guilt, he is perfect, or he didn't prepare very thoughtfully.

Parenthesis Surround the Tongue Talk

- (**Open:** "As the body apart from the spirit is dead, so also faith apart from works is dead." ~ v. 2:26
) **Close:** "So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin." ~ v. 4:17

Four Ways the Tongue Can Violate Faith

1. True Faith won't assert itself as a teacher when one is not a teacher ~ v. 3:1

True Teacher: One granted authority by others (or God) to instruct or manage others, according to an accepted standard of truth.

False Teacher: a) One who instructs/manages others without proper authority.
b) One who instructs/manages others in violation of the standard of truth.

2. True Faith won't assert itself in arguing/fighting ~ vv. 4:1-10

Improper Passions: You want, but don't get (your want is a demand?) ~ v. 1

Improper Actions: You covet; you murder (want so bad you'll mistreat others?) ~ v. 2

Improper Prayer: You ask, to consume on your lusts (asking God to help you sin?) ~ v.3

Improper Worship: You adulterers; friends of the world; enemies of God ~ v. 4-10

3. True Faith won't assert itself by grumbling (speaking evil, slander) ~ vv. 4:11-12

= **Judging:** Render verdict and sentence. ~ v. 11&12

= **Exalt self over Law:** "speak evil against Law" ~ v. 11

= **Equals Disobey Law:** "not a doer of the Law" ~ v. 11

Paul's take on grumbling: God hates idolatry, sexual Immorality, & grumbling, and has made that perfectly clear. ~ see 1 Cor. 10:1-12

4. True Faith won't assert itself by boasting about the future ~ vv. 4:13-16

Claims too much: We control our future v. we are a vapor ~ vv. 13-14

Claims too little: God unimportant to my future v. God essential to my future ~ v. 15

Such boasting: Is arrogant and evil ~ v. 16

Commitment Card (this is a private card between you and God)

On the back side of this box is a series of commitments, built around these verses we've just looked at. At the end of today's sermon, you will be invited to initial each of these commitments.

As we continue to the back side of this outline, we're going to hear 4 "nuggets" that James included in his "tongues" section of his epistle. These nuggets serve to clarify and focus the challenges he gave to the Bride of Christ. God has called us to be a separate people, a people who don't "do life" the way the world does, or the way that Satan tempts.

Rather, we are called by God to simply do God's will, and to only do it God's way.

Four Nuggets by Which we Might Check Ourselves

1. **Teachers will be judged more strictly** ~ v. 3:2 ***Thus we must have good ones!***
Pray for our teachers: that God would make clear His Word and will.
Hold our teachers to God's standards: and not let a teacher slop or twist the Word of God.
Prepare our lessons rightly: to teach God's Word the way God intends it.

2. **We all stumble in many ways** ~ v. 3:2 ***Thus we must . . .***
Strive for perfection: in ourselves.
Not demand perfection: from one another.
Not enable one another: to continue in these sinful practices.

3. **The tongue brings huge consequences** ~ v. 3:3-6 ***Thus we must help one another to . . .***
Grow away from the evil consequences of evil talk.
Grow toward the good consequences of good talk.

4. **God and Satan will respond to our "lean"** ~ v. 4:6-8 ***Thus we must . . .***
Submit to God and He will draw near (always do God's will God's way).
Resist the Devil and he will flee (don't ever solve life's problems/issues his way).
